Get Set 4 PE scheme (5 years)	£2150	To ensure staff are confident in delivering the core PE curriculum	Higher quality of lessons being delivered, increased subject knowledge. A more consistent and rigorous approach to PE lessons with clear progression. Good use of visual models and video resources being utilised. Teachers more confident in assessing aspects of PE Curriculum.
School playground physical activity markings	£3525	To provide children with physical activity markings to encourage active playtimes and lunchtimes.	Children enjoy using the agility and physical activity markings during breaktimes and lunchtimes and is used daily by many children. These have created wider opportunities for active and healthy play. They are also utilised for warm up activities during outdoor PE sessions.
Gymnastics equipment	£3920.84	Equipment to enable teachers to deliver high quality gymnastics lessons to all children.	The children have enjoyed utilising the equipment purchased and it has enabled them to showcase excellent physical skills in gymnastics. The varied heights of the gymnastics agility tables allows for wider progression of skills to be demonstrated.
Games & Athletics equipment	£3682	Equipment to enable teachers to deliver high quality PE lessons to all children.	PE equipment stocked up in relevant areas for Reception to Year Four in school. This has ensured that pupils have suitable equipment to use in different sports.

Sports Day equipment	£181.28	To provide children with a safe and enjoyable Sports Day experience.	This expenditure allowed for all children an enjoyable experience at sports day, as they all received stickers, as well as medals awarded to the winning individuals. Finally, it also provided equipment used in races at sports day to be used in PE lessons prior to the event.
PE equipment storage	£1966.92	To store and access PE equipment in an organised manner, ensuring all resources and equipment are easily accessible.	This has enabled staff to easily access necessary equipment in the PE cupboard to deliver high-quality PE lessons throughout the year. The organisation of equipment ensures it is stored safely reducing unnecessary damage.
Cooperation circle bikes	£344	To provide children in school with appropriate experiences of physical development within their own needs.	These cooperation circle bikes are regularly used by younger children in school, as well as children with educational needs to provide them with movement breaks as well as giving children opportunities to develop gross motor skills. All pupils accessing the circle bikes have enriched playtime physical opportunities.
SEN sensory equipment	£609.96	To provide children with special educational needs with appropriate equipment to meet their sensory and physical development needs.	Equipment has been used in the Sensory Circuits room to provide children with a safe space to meet their sensory needs. Children regularly use this equipment and are then able to return to the classroom calm and relaxed, ready to get involved with classroom activities.
